Make an American flag windsock. Color white stars on a sheet of blue construction paper and tape edges together to make a cylinder. Cut strips of red and white paper streamers. Tape the streamers to the inside of the blue cylinder. Tape yarn to the opposite opening of the construction paper to hang your windsock.
