Fun Sheets are part of the Super Citizen Program your child is participating in at school. These optional enrichment activities encourage learning between child and parent because, after all, becoming a Super Citizen starts at home. You do not need to return these activities to the classroom unless specified by your teacher.

Vocabulary:

Right - something that is guaranteed to each and every person

Responsibility - taking care of the things we are supposed to do

Attitude - the way we choose to think about people or things in our mind

Character - to have qualities such as honesty, courage and integrity

Community Service - voluntary work that is by someone to help others

Fun Fact:

Did you know that any time you do something that helps others without asking for something in return, that's considered community service?

Activity:

Interview a family member or friend that you believe is a super citizen. Ask this person to choose three words that describe his/her character and tell why he/she chose those words.



Writing/Discussion Prompt:

You have been asked to start a project to help your community. Describe your project and how it will make your community a better place.



Research Idea:

Many communities have service groups that help to make it a great place to live. Find out what organizations help to improve your community. How can you help?
